Our community gathers for the High Holy Days in Fellowship Hall of Summit Church in the West Mt. Airy neighborhood of Northwest Philadelphia.

Enter at 6757 Greene St. near the corner of Westview, one block from Lincoln Drive.

(We are two blocks from the SEPTA "Chestnut Hill West" UPSAL train station.)

Selichot: SATURDAY night, Sept. 21, 9 - 11 PM. This opening service of the HolyDays begins the personal and communal process of *t'shuvah*.

Erev Rosh HaShanah: SUNDAY evening, Sept. 29, 6 - 7 PM. A short, festive gathering for the whole community: singing, *davvenen'*, candle-lighting, and apples & honey.

Rosh HaShanah: morning services:

MONDAY morning, Sept. 30, 10 AM – 2:30 PM. Beginnings are important!

TUESDAY morning, Oct. 1, 10 AM – 2:30 PM. Please arrive early!

A vegetarian/dairy potluck lunch follows each service. Please bring food to share.

Yom Kippur: Please arrive early for these services!

TUESDAY evening, Oct. 8, 6 – 8:30 PM. **Evening Service/Kol Nidre**

WEDNESDAY, Oct. 9, 10 AM – 8:30 PM. **All day and evening,**

including *Havdala* and *N'eila*. A vegetarian/dairy potluck break-fast follows.

Sukkot:

SUNDAY 12 noon, Oct. 13, join us to build the sukkah!

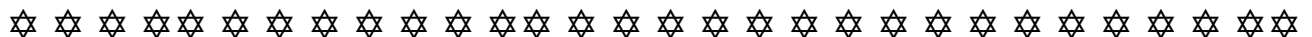
SUNDAY evening, Oct. 13, our beautiful sukkah will be available for all who wish to gather for an informal Erev Sukkot dinner in the sukkah.
